

Parables 8 2/26/23 Luke 15:1-10

1. Drew's sermon focused on the parables of the lost coin and lost sheep. The context for these parables is that the other religious leaders are angry at Jesus because he was eating with sinners and tax collectors. These two groups of people were seen as outcasts in their society: tax collectors were sellouts to the Roman government who were extortioners, and sinners were those who knowingly walked outside of God's law, such as prostitutes or slave traders.

\*\*Who are these "outcasts" in our modern society? In other words, who should we invite to eat with us?

\*\*Would people like these feel welcomed at our church? If so, why? If not, what needs to change?

**2**. Forefront's vision for the rest of 2023 is "For the One." This is a double meaning. First of all, we are for the one which is God.
