1. The Exodus (crossing the Red Sea and deliverance from Egypt) is the foundational event in the history of Israel. Drew began his message by asking about the biggest moment in your life.

**What is the biggest moment in your life that had a massive impact on the future?

2. Drew described how God gave Pharaoh at least 5 chances to let his people go, but in the end, time ran out. **Does God give us a limited or unlimited number of chances to repent and believe in him?

3. Read Exodus 12:12-13 and 12:21-28. Feel free to glance through the surrounding texts as well. Answer this multiple choice question from the Passover story:

**From what does the blood of the lamb actually save the Israelites?

- A. SinB. EgyptC. The Destroyer
- D. Death

**After reading the text, does anything surprise you as it relates to this question?

**Give evidence for your answer and discuss any implications from your answer.

4. One of Drew's main points was "True freedom is more than escaping sin, true freedom means conquering sin." Read Romans 6:8-14 through this lens. As you discuss the following questions, feel free to take into account the verses surrounding this passage.

**What does Paul have to say about the power of sin?

**What is it that breaks the power of sin? (yes, I know it is a "sunday school" answer, but have you ever thought about it this way before?)



5. Based on the fact that God's grace reaches down to us first (just like it did to the Israelites), Drew asked us to think about what our next step of faith might be. He gave three ideas:

- 1. Plug into a lifegroup
- 2. Join the Dream Team (find a way to serve at church)
- 3. Get one on one (find a mentor, be a mentor)

Since this guide is designed for life groups at Forefront, most of you reading this are already doing #1 (yay!). Many of you are also serving at church (thank you!). So #3 is probably the least common one among us.
