1. Drew began his sermon by talking about how we don't think everyone is deserving of good things.

**Who is the person in your life, that when something bad happens to them, you cheer on the inside?

For more discussion: It is often due to world or cultural events that make a specific group of people seem unloveable when a stereotype is assigned to that group. For example, Japanese-Americans were hated during and even after World War II, or Americans viewed Muslims with suspicion after 9/11.

**What world or cultural event has happened recently, or is even happening right now, that is creating this separation between people, or even makes you think they are unloveable?

2. The reality is that God calls us to reach out to everyone, including those we may unknowingly deem "unloveable"

**What can you do to make an inroad with someone who our culture writes off, or what can you do to make an inroad with someone who has written off a Christian?

3. Many in mainstream culture today equate love with affirmation.

**Is there a difference between love and affirmation?

**How did Jesus live out his love of people while calling them to change their behavior?

**What is it that actually can change a person's behavior? How have you experienced this change in your own life?

**How can you leverage that experience to share with another person?
